Registrations for Full Day Kindergarten, both Junior and Senior Registration, will take place on an on going basis starting

February 1, 2017. Please contact the school at any time with your child's name and birth date and arrange a day to come in to pick up a registration package. In order for your child to begin junior kindergarten in the Fall of 2017, your child must be 4 by December 31, 2017. Please ensure that you have the following documentation for registration as we cannot register your child without these items: Child's Birth Certificate, Baptism Certificate, and Immunization Record (yellow card), as well as a copy of a **parent** Catholic Baptism Certificate and a copy of your property taxes form showing Separate School Support or proof of address.
