SAFETY & SECURITY IN OUR YARD

Our school playground is supervised in the morning starting at 8:45 a.m. and in the afternoon until 3:40 p.m. Please be aware that for the safety of our children, no pets are allowed on school property. This includes lap dogs or dogs that are carried.

We ask that the parents/guardians use the walkway, on the west side along the front fence of the schoolyard to wait for children. At the end of the school day, please wait for children in this area only and not in front of the school along the wall on the east side. The congestion created by parents waiting to pick up children is creating a safety concern for our bus students who are loading buses at this time. All students who walk home should exit out their assigned doors and walk through the field area, along the sidewalk at the front of the school or around the back to the catwalk in the parking lot area. Parents are not to wait on the school yard or in the back yard area. Please arrange for a spot to meet your child. Through this practice we will be able to ensure that your child can exit the school safely.

SIMCOE COUNTY INCLEMENT WEATHER ZONES

To limit bus cancellations if weather conditions warrant, the Simcoe County Student Transportation Consortium (SCSTC) has developed "Inclement Weather Zones." These four zone areas have been determined based on weather patterns, school catchment areas, routes that cross over catchment areas and special needs transportation. The



four weather zones - North, South, Central and West - will allow for partial cancellations. For example, when the weather in the Collingwood area is such that it is not safe for the buses to travel the roads, then buses in the West Weather Zone would be cancelled, while the buses in remaining three zones would continue to run. No school belongs in more than one zone. **Monsignor Clair School is in the Central Zone.**

TOUR FOR HUMANITY BUS

We are thrilled to announce that the **Tour For Humanity Bus** will be visiting our school on **Friday October 27th** from 9:00 - 3:30. This is a state of the art, technologically advanced, mobile human rights education centre. The goal of this program is to create and to motivate everyone to create positive change within the home, school and community. The topics covered will compliment the work that is taught within the junior/intermediate classrooms. Friends of Simon Wiesenthal Centre for Holocaust Studies (FSWC) works to promote tolerance, justice and human rights. FSWC is guided by the concept of Tikkun Olam - a Hebrew term meaning "Repair of the World".

Funding has been made available in partnership with the Ontario English Catholic Teacher's Association (OECTA) and the Simcoe Muskoka Catholic District School Board (SMCDSB).

Parents are invited to take part in the Tour For Humanity experience.

LOST AND FOUND

Every year, each month we will be bagging and donating all lost and found items. Please remind your children to check the lost and found frequently if they are missing any articles. The donation will be made at the end of each month. Mr. Laurin will bag up lost and found items on November 4th. Please remember to label all items and toys with your child's name. This way we can assist in returning lost items to the rightful owners.

TELEPHONE USE

The school phone is in constant use by our staff. Students are not permitted to use the phone except in the case of an emergency. Please remember to make all arrangements with your child ahead of time for dismissal or pick up from any extracurricular

activities. In order to ensure the safety of your child at all times, a note to the classroom teacher or the office is the best way to deliver a change in their daily schedule. If there is no note concerning instructions for your child we will default to the regular routine.

LUNCH TIME

Students are outside for 40 minutes each lunch hour. Please ensure your children are dressed appropriately for the weather. Students are not permitted to go to the local plaza without parental supervision. They must be signed in/out at the office by a parent/guardian. Students who go home for lunch on a regular basis must have a note filed with their teacher.

VISITORS

For the ongoing safety of the children, please continue to sign in if you are visiting the school. Please do not go into the school yard without a visitor tag. This includes in the morning before classes start. Visitor tags are available at the front desk in the office. Please set an appointment with the teacher if you wish to visit the classroom or speak to the teacher. If you are signing your child out early please come to the office and Mrs. McVeigh or Mrs. Everett will call your child to the office. If you are signing your child in late we are encouraging all children from grades 1-8 to walk to class on their own. We are trying to minimize interruptions during instructional time.
