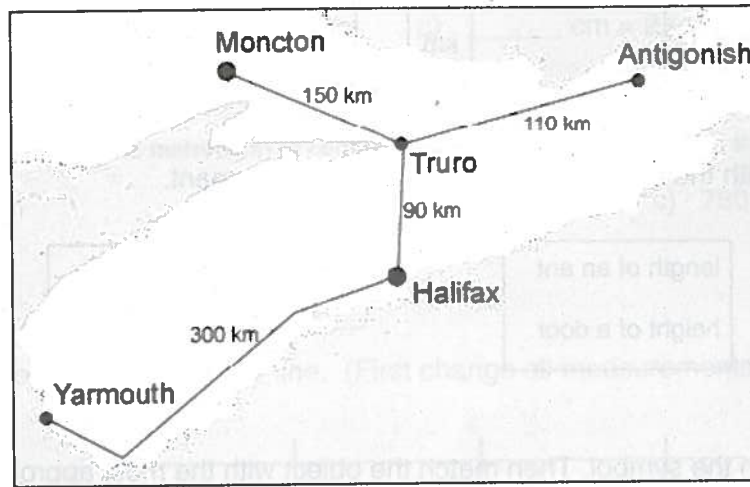


James uses a map to plan a trip to Nova Scotia and New Brunswick.
